# **Scripps Ranch High School**

## **School Profile for 2023-24**

*Scripps Ranch High School* is one of 18 high schools in the city of San Diego. It is one of two high schools in the Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch section of the city, an involved community which places great value on strong academic standards. The school enrollment of 1928 students includes approximately 20% who live outside the residential area.

**SRHS** is a leader in student achievement in the Greater San Diego County area and has been recognized as a California Distinguished School, a National Blue Ribbon School and a California Honor Roll School. In addition, SRHS earned high National and metro-area rankings in 2023-2024 *U.S. News and World Report's* "Best High Schools." These accolades are evident in the accomplishments of the Class of 2023, which boasted (9) National Merit Scholarship Semi-Finalists and 98 California Scholarship Federation Life Members.

In addition to academic enrichment, SRHS offers a myriad of extracurricular opportunities for students, including seasonal sports teams, ASB, Marching and Concert Bands, Color Guard, Drama, Orchestra, Journalism, Yearbook, and approximately 95 school clubs which engage the interests of the student body.

<u>Course Standards</u>: Courses required for graduation include Board-adopted standards. Standards are the skills and knowledge students should be proficient in to pass a specific course. Per the board policy established during the 2020-2021 school year, academic grades are based solely on students' current levels of mastery of the Board-adopted standards and are not influenced by behavior or nonacademic measures. Academic grades use multiple means to assess mastery levels and include at least one opportunity for reflection, revision, and reassessment.

<u>Grade Point Average (GPA):</u> A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 is required of all graduates in grades 9-12. For college reporting, the 10-12 WGPA is used. AP and Honors courses are weighted and earn an extra grade point. College courses are weighted and will earn two credits per semester.
