- ❖ Our **school colors** are **navy blue, cardinal red and white**.
- ❖ Our website is <https://scrippsranch.sandiegounified.org/> (check it regularly!)
- ❖ Our counseling website is <https://www.srhscounseling.com/>
- ❖ We send home **progress reports** at the 6 week and 12-week period each semester. At 18 weeks, you will receive a **semester report card** for each semester. During Distance Learning, Progress Reports are issued at 4 ½ weeks. The quarters are 9 weeks long.
- ❖ You may access **PowerSchool** by using your school ID and password. Parents may use their log-in information or may use their son/daughter’s log-in information. Go to **powerschool.sandi.net** and enter their **ID and Password**.
- ❖ **PowerSchool** is very useful in seeing the progress made in many classes. You may also check your attendance and other helpful links. Anything in blue is a live link.
- ❖ We do not have lockers, but most teachers will let students know when to bring their books.
- ❖ Counselors may be reached by students before school, lunch time, after school or by filling out a **“Request to See Counselor Form”** located in the counseling center. You may also email your counselor.
- ❖ **If you have a question or concern** about a class or teacher, you need to contact the teacher directly by phone or email.
- ❖ Grades from **1st semester qualify students** for classes the following year during articulation. Grades need to be maintained 2nd semester for advanced, honors and AP classes.
- ❖ **Read the Course Descriptions** on the counseling website under “Academics” for specific information about prerequisites needed for certain classes.
- ❖ **To remain in the advanced, honors and AP programs**, students need to earn A/B grades in previous advanced level courses.
- ❖ **Honors and AP courses are on a 5-point scale** (all other classes are on a 4-point scale). D and F grades are not weighted!
- ❖ **Students MUST not have any D grades in any A-G courses for 4-year college**. D grades must be remediated in summer school or through Edgenuity (on-line learning program).
- ❖ **Athletes** must make up any D’s earned PRIOR to the senior year in order to qualify for NCAA.

Welcome Future Falcons!

At SRHS...

- There is something for everyone!
-
- It is important to be organized; do your homework, turn everything in, ask for help.
- Organization is the key. Self-accountability is important. Check PowerSchool at least 1 time per week.
- Get involved! Sports, music, clubs, cheer, school and community service....

It is important that YOU understand...

- The importance of your 8th grade year.
- If you are lacking in any area, you need to see your teacher and develop an action-plan now.
- Athletic and extra-curricular participation requires a minimum GPA of 2.0 in both academics and citizenship
- Planner use is critical to student success. You should have no missing assignments!
- Grades and end-of-course exams are used for class placement
- Your end-of-course exam for math will also be used to determine your math placement. Grades and teacher recommendation will be used if end-of-course exam is not available.

Looking at High School....

- There are 8 SEMESTERS in the whole High School experience – Make each semester count!
- Regardless of what you do after high school, it is critical that you have good study habits.
- Set goals for yourself (both short-term and long-term).
- Level of rigor should be maintained or increased as you progress through High School.
- Graduation requirements include:
 - ✓ Completing the A-G graduation requirements
 - ✓ 44 credits
 - ✓ 2.0 GPA in grades 9-12
 - ✓ Two years of PE (Marching Band/Drill, Dance, AFJROTC, Cheer)

Articulation Card

- Please read and follow instructions when we send the official materials in February.
- Due date for your class is Friday, March 5th.
- Talk to your current teachers for input on classes.
- Read the Course Descriptions found on the counseling website (srhscounseling.com). Go to Academics and scroll down to Course Descriptions.
- MAKE SURE YOU READ THE PREREQUISITES!
- Make informed decisions and remember that we DO NOT make any class changes after **KICK-OFF**. Be aware that classes may be closed so make your best choices now! If classes are full, we cannot accommodate the change.
- Remember that grades and end-of-year exams are used for placement.
- Please be aware that in order for a student to remain in any advanced level courses at SRHS, the student **must earn a minimum of a B grade** to continue in the advanced subject.

Course Selection

- You will notice that the classes are listed in order of the A-G graduation requirements. It is important to be aware of each of the categories.
- **Area A- History/Social Sciences.** There is no history for grade 9. History will be taken in grades 10–12.
- **Area B – English.** If you are in 8th grade English, you go to English 1-2. Students in English with an A grade and teacher recommendation may go to English Cluster 1-2. English Cluster 8 with grade A or B goes to English Cluster 1-2, same for Seminar. C grade in English Cluster or Seminar goes to English 1-2.
- **Area C - Math.** **We honor the District's Math Performance Expectations and the recommendations for placement based on end of the year grade and End of Year Course Exam.* CC Math 8 goes to Integrated Math I. Placement test will determine if advanced. Students with a B or higher in AIM I may select AIM II at this time. Final placement will be determined at the end of the year.
- **Area D – Science.** Everyone will take Physics. Students who are in Common Core Math 8 will take Physics 1-2. Students who test into AIM I or are enrolled in AIM II may select Advanced Physics if they earned an A in Science.
- **Area E – Language Other Than English.** A minimum of 2 years of the same language are required for graduation. You need to decide if it is best to start this year. SRHS currently only offers ASL 1-2 and 3-4. We do not offer a 3rd year of ASL. Please choose two languages (1st choice, 2nd choice) if requesting a first year LOTE class.
- **PE – Required for all Freshmen.** PE, PE Dance, Marching Band/Drill or AFJROTC. Marching Band must be taken in conjunction with an instrumental music class, except for students who are on the Drill Team. If you make an athletic or cheer team, we will adjust your schedule if needed. Check the SRHS webpage for information about try-outs.

Areas F, G and Other Electives

****Select at least 6 courses across areas F, G and Other Electives. Number them in order of preference 1-6.**

Select classes based on your interest areas.

- **Area F – VAPA.** Must complete 1 year of a VAPA course in grades 9-12
- **Area G – College Prep Elective.** Students usually fulfill this requirement as upperclassman. Math higher than Integrated Math III, 3rd year of Language Other than English and courses on the card under area G are all examples of a G College Prep Elective. Only one year is required.

Review the second page of card, including all the required signatures.

Keep in mind your overall time commitments (sports, family responsibilities, work, community service, rigor of classes etc.) when choosing your classes for next year.

Remember...NO CHANGES after Kick-off!!!

There is no guarantee that classes will be open at this late date, so choose wisely the first time around!

- **If you do not qualify for a class because of grades at this time:**
 - ✓ You must select the class you qualify for now
 - ✓ There will be an opportunity to communicate improvements and qualify the beginning of June.

***Please share this information with your parent/guardian!**

STUDENT PLANNER LESSON

- Use your Planner DAILY.
- Write down daily assignments in planner. *If no homework, write what you are working on in class so you can review/study at home!

Best Practice:

- Spend a minimum of 20 minutes **studying/reviewing/practicing/annotating for each academic class per night!** (Example: If you have 3 academic classes, and no assigned homework, you STILL have 60 minutes of studying/practicing/reviewing for that day).
- **While studying, if any questions arise or you get stumped on a concept or problem, WRITE your questions and share with your teacher the next day!**
- After completing each assignment, put a check mark in your planner, next to the assignment so you can visually see that you have finished.
- Complete all class and home assignments on time and to the best of your ability. Do not accept zeros! Effort counts!
- Ask for help when you do not understand something! Seek your teacher's assistance during Flex time and ask about your teachers tutoring schedule.
